the muster of the State Retirement plan as Senator Whitney stated with regard to his amendment. Section 6 amends Section 24-701 to specify that Associate County Judges..oh,no. That's the same one. Then the next Section, 7, takes 24-703 which is right along the same line to specify that retirement fees shall not be collected on parking tickets and other non-moving violations. We had already passed legislation to that affect in past sessions of the Legislature and it'd stipulate in local ordinances that it would strike any cross references to that and make sure that they are not paid because they don't have to be. Section 8 amends Section 25-1631 to included County and Municipal Judges among those to be authorized to be present when names are drawn for jury duty, since the District Court jury lists are now being used in County and Municipal Courts, this will permit the judges, then, to perform their duties when jurors are needed. This carries out our jury duty requirements under the bill. Section 9 removes the requirement for filing copies of abstracts for traffic convictions with the County Treasurer, again, the same reason that we mentioned to you before since this is now all handled through the state, there is no need to handle it through the County Treasurer. So, it will eliminate some of the work for the Treasurers office in handling this paper work and all of them. This used to be very necessary in the days of the J.P., but now we do not have them. That recordkeeping thing will be cleared up and we will save some money that way. Committee amendment 9, also, further amends to clarify record-keeping and requires the reporting of cases in which probation was granted which is consistent with other legislation which we have handled in this session of the Legislature. Section 10 amends 39-795 to conform with changes in that section and Section 11 amends 39-796 requiring the Department of Motor Vehicles to prescribe and furnish an abstract a conviction reports for traffic cases. This, by the way, will allow the Director to authorize the use of forms provided by the Court and law enforcement agencies and they are working right now, and I think this is to their credit. They are working on establishing a uniform traffic citation and complaint form for use throughout the state. This is most necessary and this will give us a much bet,,more unified approach to all traffic problems, and that will...this amendment will permit its use. Section 12 specifies an Associate County Judge may perform marriages. There is some question about that. I don't think, Senator Cavanaugh, you would object to that particular thing because it is true that where Associate Judges are in some towns away from the County seat, this would be most helpful. Then, it also adds a Section 33-140 which clarifies payment of jurors fees. Counties will be responsible, and so forth, which we have already gone in to regarding the amendments.

SENATOR CAL CARSTEN: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I wonder if I could ask..if Senator Luedtke would yield to a question.

SENATOR CAL CARSTEN: Senator Luedtke, I had a communication from the Judges in my district that I think I talked to you about this before, relative to the requirement that Judges be present for the drawing of juries. Do you recall, and has this been taken care of.

SENATOR CAL CARSTEN: OK.
