SENATOR CARPENTER: LB 257 which is at the head of General File is a bill that I held up to amend. The amendment is through and I now move to advance 257 from General File to E & R for Initial.

PRESIDENT: Stand by just a minute here. What do we have on LB 257?

CLERK: Mr. President, this was a bill introduced by Senator Proud at the request of the Governor. Reads title. The bill was first considered on March 23, laid over on April 2 and again laid over on, there are now no amendments on the bill.

PRESIDENT: Is there any further discussion of the bill? Then Senator Carpenter your motion was to just move the bill on? Very good. Question is, shall LB 257 be advanced from General File to E & R Initial? All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote no. Moving on the advancement of LB 257 from General File to E & R Initial. Have you all voted? Clerk will record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, no nays, 24 not voting.

PRESIDENT: 257 is advanced. Do we have other business?

CLERK: Mr. President, we have a request to bracket LB 7 on General File until final action is taken on LB 226.

PRESIDENT: Senator Luedtke.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I would ask that, ask unanimous consent to bracket LB 7. 226 is the bill which dealt with the, all the changes and refinements in LB 1032 from the last session. LB 7 also deals with the same related subjects and it will be unnecessary to have both of these bills since LB 226 can carry all the matters which is in 7 so we will wait for 226 to go across the board; if it does and just hold 7 and then 7 can be just killed or, if we don't need it.

PRESIDENT: Senator Luedtke asking unanimous consent to bracket LB 7 on General File. Are there any objections? Any objections? Hearing none, so ordered. The bill is bracketed then on General File until 226 goes across.

CLERK: All right, Mr. President, then I ask unanimous consent to bracket LB 312 indefinitely to await preparation of amendments. Signed Senator Schmidt. LB 312 was previously unbracketed for tomorrow.

PRESIDENT: Senator Schmidt in the Chamber? Senator Schmidt what is your pleasure here on your motion to indefinitely bracket LB 312?

CLERK: That's his request, to just bracket it indefinitely.

PRESIDENT: Any explanation?

SENATOR SCHMIDT: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, we have an amendment we're trying to put together for LB 312 and therefore we'd like to remove the date and leave the bill bracketed at the top of General File at this time.
