PRESIDENT: Any further discussion of the Maresh amendment? Question is shall the Maresh amendment be added to LB 546 on select file? All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote no. Clerk will record.

CLERK: 29 ayes on the motion to adopt, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Very good. Are there--the amendment is adopted. Now, are there other amendments to 546?

CLERK: None.

PRESIDENT: Are we in position to move the bill on?

CLERK: Yes.

PRESIDENT: Senator Maresh, what is your pleasure regarding 546 now as amended from select file?

SENATOR MARESH: I move that it be advanced.

PRESIDENT: You heard the motion now to advance LB 546 as amended. Is there a need for discussion? All those in favor of advancing 546 as amended, please say aye. Those opposed say no. It is so ordered, the bill as amended is advanced. Do we have other motions there on the desk to reconsider?

CLERK: None, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Stand by, Senator Carpenter, we've got some appointments over here, possibly. Yes, take the appointment.

CLERK: Mr. President, there are-- there are committee on committee reports (read)

PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator Whitney.

SENATOR WHITNEY: Mr. President and Members of the Legislature. So far as I know, these men are not controversial and so I would like to ask that all of them be approved at one time. I shall list their names; E. K. Yanney for the Nebraska Investment Council; now this is found on page 1161 of your Journal. Charles Broderson, Code of Ethics Board; Donald R. Treadway, Code of Ethics Board; and then we have also Thomas D. Doyle, Code of Ethics Board; William E. Peters, Code of Ethics Board; Charles Davey, Department of Economic Development Advisory Committee; then on page 1163 is John Sullivan Agricultural Products Industrial Utilization Committee, and Ray R. Young, Public Welfare and Public Institutions Advisory Committee, and so I move that the Legislature confirm these appointments and suggest a record vote. First I'd like to ask unanimous consent to vote on all of them at the same time.

PRESIDENT: Alright. Senator Whitney now is asking unanimous consent to vote on all of the commitments--excuse me, all of the appointments that he has mentioned. Are there any objections to taking just one vote on all of the appointments? Any objections? Hearing none, so ordered then, we'll take one vote on all the appointments and that'll take care of it. Now, back to you, Senator Whitney.

SENATOR WHITNEY: Okay. I so move that all of them be confirmed.
