Senator Lewis asking for a Call of the House. The Clerk will clear the Board. The question is shall there be a Call of the House. All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote no. Senator Lewis is asking for a Call of the House. Have you all voted? Once again, have you all voted for a Call of the House?

CLERK: 24 ayes, 14 nays on a Call of the House.

PRESIDENT: Motion prevails. We are under a Call of the House. Please, will the Senators take their seats? Next bell, please indicate your presence so we can find out who is here and who is missing. We are under Call of the House. Have you all indicated your presence. The clerk will record. The issue under vote is the Senator Lewis' amendment to LB 449. We didn't catch who said what here. Senator Marsh, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR MARSH: I would like to know who is excused?

PRESIDENT: Well, that is what we are trying to find out. Stand by, please.

CLERK: Senator Syas, Keyes, Frank Lewis, and Cal Carsten are excused.

PRESIDENT: Senator Syas, Keyes, Frank Lewis. Did I hear Cal Carsten? OK.

CLERK: Senator Hasebroock voting no on the original motion.

PRESIDENT: Senator Hasebroock voting no. There was an aye vote awhile ago, I thought in the back. I didn't see a hand, though, or any indication of who was voting. Senator Snyder, for what purpose do you rise? Go ahead.

SENATOR SNYDER: Mr. President, I would like to request a role call vote. I believe this is an important issue and we've got people just sitting here.

PRESIDENT: Very good. Senator Snyder requesting a roll call vote. We will now have a roll call vote. We are now under...Senator Stahmer, take your seat please. We are under Call of the House. The issue under vote is the Lewis amendment to 449, the Lewis amendment to LB 449. Senator Epke, all right. The clerk will read the amendment. This is what is under vote. Please pay attention.

CLERK: The amendment is as follows: Read. Senator Anderson voting aye. Senator Barnett voting aye. Roll Call vote taken.

PRESIDENT: Senator Duis what. Senator Duis voting no.

CLERK: Roll call vote continued.

PRESIDENT: Senator Savage, we are still under Call of the House.

CLERK: 20 ayes, 25 nays, remainder not voting.

PRESIDENT: The Lewis amendment is lost. We have, the next motion, I understand is a motion on the desk to indefinitely postpone. All right. The motion is to Raise the Call. All those in favor of raising the Call of the House vote aye. All those opposed vote no. Thank you. The clerk will record.

CLERK: 40 ayes, 1 nay, to Raise the Call.

PRESIDENT: Very good. The Call is Raised. Read the motion on the desk.

CLERK: Motion read.
