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then you know how to guard against him and you put up a shield that turns aside the sharpness of his wit. But Senator Proud, you said that if God wanted the water fluoridated, he would have done it. If he wanted you to smoke, he would have put a chimney on your head and I notice that you are smoking but you don't have...and in reality, there are many improvements that are made upon nature. I, as a barber, am often called upon by individuals who come into the barber shop to improve upon what nature has done to the top of their head. While I am down here in the Legislature, I am trying to make an improvement on what nature put inside of the head of some people. When Senator DeCamp talked about drugs being used in the school supposedly to enhance the learning of students, I am with him all the way in being opposed to these types of things. But I think fluoridation of water is different from the psychoactive drugs that were being used in the schools where the side effects were readily detectable and they showed up. They were using benzedrine, dexadrine, redelin, and other substances and in some forms, these drugs are used to cause weight loss. They are used to keep people awake, so it shouldn't surprised them when they gave these drugs to children to enhance their learning they were unable to sleep. They lost weight. They became irritable and other things showed up. These drugs were used to affect the brain and the nervous system and nobody has made the charge so far that fluoride affects the brain or the central nervous system in an adverse way. So, I think mindbending drugs are different from fluoride. Senator Snyder and others who were so concerned about local control, and I am coming to you pretty soon, Senator Maresh, I haven't forgotten you. Senator Snyder introduced a bill, I am dealing with the issues that were brought up with reference to this bill. He said something about local control, yet he wanted a transit authority bill passed for Omaha which would take the right away from the people to vote on the men who would sit on this authority...

PRESIDENT: Excuse me, Senator Nore, what is your point of order.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Nore...

PRESIDENT: With my own judgment, he is answering everything that has been said this morning that relates to the bill. I don't see him out of order. That's fine. The Maresh amendment, he is coming to that as I understand it.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Right, and Senator Nore is the last person who ought to talk about somebody rambling far afield. Whenever any issue is brought up, even if it is the newspaper at the campus in Lincoln, he can go all the way to Peking, China or Moscow, Russia, or 1313. He should never condemn anybody for being far afield. If they discuss anything in the Universe or out of it, he ought to feel it is as germane as anything he says and one of his favorite statements is idleness is the devil's workshop, but I corrected him once before and I'll do it again. An idle mind is the devil's workshop and sometime if an idle mind would become inhabited with some thinking furniture, then it wouldn't be a devil's workshop. It would be a workshop where business of the public was carried on properly and effectively and that is what I'm trying to do. Senator Maresh, you introduced a bill, if I recall, that would require deposits on certain containers. Now, you didn't want to submit this to a vote of the localities where certain items were bottled and placed in cans and your bill might have caused unemployment, so those localities may have been opposed to your bill. You wanted the state to require this but I am not calling for consistency on the part of the Legislature. All I am trying to do is show that when it suits any man's purpose to give an argument like local control, he will give it but local control is not really the issue. With this bill, it is the heat that the individuals
