way. Now Senator Snyder's asking unanimous consent to take up LB 92. Are there any objections to taking the bill up? Senator Waldron.

SENATOR WALDRON: Senator Snyder is always the one that stands up here and says we should take things in their proper order, never wants to suspend the rules to do this and so I think he should follow the proper order too when it comes his time to ask for things out of order, I'm sure he probably wants them to be that way, but I think it's only fair that I ask that he has as much respect for following proper order as the rest of us.

PRESIDENT: Okay, there's no debate on the issue and that will end that particular subject. What else do we have?

CLERK: All right, Mr. President, we have a motion to unbracket LB 43A on Select File, unanimous consent I guess.

PRESIDENT: 43A?

CLERK: 43A was considered this morning on Select File, it was laid over and bracketed until April 18. Signed, Senator Carpenter.

PRESIDENT: All right, Senator Carpenter's asking unanimous consent to unbracket 43A on Select File. Are there any objections to unbracketing 43A on Select File? Any objections? Hearing none, so ordered then. The bill is unbracketed. What other business do we have to come before the body?

CLERK: Mr. President, the E & R amendments were adopted on 43A. The E & R amendments have been adopted on 43A, there are no further amendments.

SENATOR STULL: I would move that it be moved over to E & R for Engrossing then.

PRESIDENT: All right, Senator Stull, just a minute. Senator Carpenter, what is your pleasure on 43A, you wanted the bill unbracketed, there were no objections. Do you want to move it on? All right, the motion is to advance LB 43A from Select File to E & R for Engrossing. All those in favor of the motion, please say aye. Those opposed say no. So ordered, 43A is advanced. Any other business to come before the body?

CLERK: I have a committee report, Mr. President. Reads. That's all I have, Mr. President, except for the motion to adjourn.

PRESIDENT: Any other business from the floor? Senator Barnett, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR BARNETT: Well, I had a question of the chair. I don't know as anybody objected to Senator Snyder bringing up LB 92. I think Senator Waldron was just making a statement.

PRESIDENT: Yes, well, as far, I asked, he said yes and he answered my question. I believe I heard him say yes that he objected.

SENATOR BARNETT: No, he said no.

PRESIDENT: Well, we have a motion to adjourn anyway which take precedence over it so...

CLERK: Mr. President, I have one more announcement. Reads.

PRESIDENT: Any other business to come before the body? The motion to adjourn is just a simple motion? Question is, shall we adjourn until 9:00 tomorrow morning? All those in favor of
