

SENATOR STROMER: That, would a, no I wouldn't interpret it that way. I think that would only be for the, the consulting purposes, to come here. I don't think this would have any, any references to the time when a Governor, lets say, were here to give an official message or you know, the State of the State address, or the budget message. What ever the case may be, and I think as you've already indicated, the reason that Senator Mahoney and I were trying to work out something in this particular rule, was for the very purpose that I think from, past years, that its never maybe remained consistent, from one time to the next. So there fore we wanted to put it into the rules, so that we could have some consistency, continually.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Well the point is, or should not be in here if we're going to pass this and I just, I object to or being in there. I think its unduly restricts the Governor and I for one think that it is up to us individually on all of these matters, whether it be with the press, with the Governor or with students coming in here. I, when I've had student help, I want them to be available and I agree with Senator Marsh. I think they ought to be available or otherwise the teaching process as she said isn't being answered at all and I would, I would object to the rules as they are here and I think that we have to learn to say no. We don't want to talk to somebody we don't want to be, a bothered by somebody, we're the ones that have to stand up and say no and its up to us. If we haven't got the backbone to say no, why then its our own problem.

PRESIDENT: Now the Chair would like to recognize Senator Lewis, and that the Chair does detect a problem here. We're got, we've opened up the a, Section B, of the rules here for rule change and that makes Mrs. Marsh's motion in order to be considered before the body, but we really have 3 issues here today, apparently. Now I'm going to call on Senator Duis and lets see if we can get some clarification here or some help to thread the eye of the needle here now. Senator Duis.

SENATOR DUIS: Yes, a, a, Mr. President. I would like very much if its agreeable with the Legislature, if we take up the sub-section 3 first, and lets have a vote on this, particular section instead of discussing all of the entire a rule, a lets take up these one at a time, if you don't mind and that is the one in regard to the news media accredited or other wise depending on how some people might think of accreditation. But lets go ahead with this particular one and if you don't mind, gentlemen, a if you'll confine yourself to that one at this particular time, lets get it out of the road, then we'll go on to the next, then we'll go on to the other Ameridments.
