CLERK: 25 ayes, 1 nay.

PRESIDENT: Okay, the amendment is adopted. Senator Fellman I apologize, but I got a double barreled movement here, now the question is shall the debate now cease, which was Senator Carpenter's, that the other barrel of his movement here, and the question is shall the debate now cease and does the Chair see five hands? Senator Fellman.

SENATOR FELLMAN: I'd like to, excuse me, I'd like to ask Senator Luedtke to yield to a question, it's a little out of time, but I would still like to ask the question?

PRESIDENT: Well, let's see if we are generous enough to accomodate that this morning, Senator Luedtke, will you yield?

SENATOR LUEDTKE: I yield.

SENATOR FELLMAN: Senator by your amendment, it now reads the Governor and one liaison person.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: And any, no, it doesn't say and one, and any liaison person.

SENATOR FELLMAN: That means they have to come in together, what if the Governor wants to come alone or a liaison person wants to come alone? I mean I think even your Governor would be a --

SENATOR LUEDTKE: My Governor, my Governor is your Governor.

SENATOR FELLMAN: I think we are boxed into a corner here worse then when we started with this amendment and it seems to me the whole amendment is silly, I can't see any reason why the Governor shouldn't be able to walk in here and I don't see any reason why we have to buck for the command post situation that Senator Carstens described, I think by and large the Governor ought to be able to send a liaison person in here and certainly we shouldn't set up tight rules like this one.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Were you asking me a question?

SENATOR FELLMAN: Originally yes.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: May I answer it?

SENATOR FELLMAN: Yes.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Alright, I'll answer it, that is not the intent, the intent is the Governor and one, they don't have to come together, it just says and one, you can have at least that, and one or any, excuse me any, the Governor and any liaison person means that he and could come in together or the Governor can come in alone, it doesn't say they've got to be there at the same time. The intent is that you can have the liaison person here or you can have the Governor here, or you can have both of them here.

SENATOR FELLMAN: But the language says, the Governor and --

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Well you go ahead, go ahead and amend it to say that, the intent is on the record here before this body what I mean.
