SENATOR FELLMAN: Well if I were to amend, I would amend by striking, but it seems to me that the simple meaning of the language A and B means that they have to come in together.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: No, it does not mean that.

PRESIDENT: Well, Senator Carpenter has asked for the previous question, does the Chair see five hands? I'm sorry the Chair did not see five hands, thank you, the question is, shall the debate now close and that would be as related to section, sub section 4 of the amendment, all those in favor of closing debate will vote aye, all those opposed will vote no. Once again may I remind you that the issue is shall the debate now close, this would be on sub section 4. The previous question has been called, have you all voted? I suppose I should remind the body that the close debate on this on a previous question has been moved it takes the majority of the elected members and that would be 25 votes. Once again have you all voted? The Clerk will record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 8 nays.

PRESIDENT: Alright, the debate will now close. Senator Duis, do you care to close on the amended section 4?

SENATOR DUIS: I would just ask the vote, thank you.

PRESIDENT: The question is shall the sub section 4 as amended by Senator Luedtke's motion be adopted, as a rule change, all those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote no. Senator Cavanaugh for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Could you read that, I'm not sure I know how it reads now?

PRESIDENT: Sure, it says the Governor and any liaison person for consultation who shall have access to roped area under north or south balcony. Well have you all voted? The Clerk will record.

CLERK: 10 ayes, 21 nays.

PRESIDENT: The motion is lost. Now we have Senator Marsh's motion on the desk which relates to the same section, and that's the next issue before the body.

CLERK: To amend rule 2 section 3B, sub 2 officers and employees of the legislature and student assistants, signed Senator Marsh.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Marsh.

SENATOR MARSH: For the students and for the Senators who have student assistants assigned to them, I urge the adoption of this amendment.

PRESIDENT: Is there any further now, discussion of that particular rule, Senator Carpenter and then Senator Duis.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Well we are going to turn this floor into a University Forum. This has no restriction whether they are hired or not, any Senator can bring in a half a dozen students and they may be alright, but I think this body is here for other purposes than that, and this is almost without any restriction. Now there are many students for example, not many, there are some on the payroll being paid and I presume there are others who are not being paid, and if you are going to open this thing up for example, why you just put up here another branch of the University of Nebraska, if that's what you want I'm in favor of it.
