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now that they are all present at one time and I really don't know how many there are as a total group. But, I think there is a deeper issue to this, that some of us went to the Executive Board sometime ago and we asked for some help and the type of help that we were given was not what we wanted or needed, but the type that I really needed was the young lady who is working with me twenty hours a week and doing things for me. Someone that I can trust just to do these things for me and I don't think we should try to go through a subterfuge and ask the Executive Board to hire her for \$1.00 a month so that she could be in access on this floor. I think that there should be some reasoning, that we should allow them to be here when they are needed and with some limitation on time.

PRESIDENT: The chair recognizes Senator Kremer.

SENATOR KREMER: I do not think that Senator Marsh meant that we are going to open this up to any flock of students who want to come in here. I don't think we are going to resolve this on the floor this morning. I would remove that we refer this section of the proposed Rule change back to the Rules Committee and they come in, hopefully, with the right kind of language to say who can be, and especially those that are assigned to us, not those that we want, but Wesleyan, Nebraska Wesleyan and University do choose a few students and they assign them to a few of us. I have not found this objectionable. I think it is good. It is good for the students and I do move that this section of the Rule change be referred back to the Committee and to bring back to us the proper language.

PRESIDENT: Senator Marsh, do you have a comment? Or do you concur? The question is, then, shall the Rule change be sent back to the Rules Committee, the amendment. All those in favor say aye. Those opposed say no. So ordered, then, the Rule change will go to the Committee. A good way to dispose of it. Thank you. Senator Duis, are we through then with the Rules change. I believe there is another section.

SENATOR DUIS: We are through with that particular Rule because we have just about left it as it was, so, if we might move on to #6, please.

CLERK: Mr. President, this is the amendment by Senator Kremer offered to the Rules Committee. The actual amendment is found on Page 992 of the Journal. It reads as follows: Read.

SENATOR DUIS: Mr. President, I ask for the adoption of this Rule change which was made by Senator Kremer which the Rule Committee felt was a good change, inasmuch as one who introduces a Resolution should have some voice in it and, also, be able to know when all of its hearings and such are taking place and so we ask for adoption of the Rule.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion, now, of the Rule change? Senator Syas, then Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR SYAS: Just one question of Senator Duis. What if the person that introduces the Resolution doesn't want to serve on the Committee? Does he have to?

SENATOR DUIS: Senator Syas, I think a Resolution introduction is the same as a bill. If you have no intention of supporting it, you shouldn't have introduced it.

SENATOR SYAS: That's not the point, now, supporting it. It is a matter that a person might feel...

SENATOR DUIS: We feel as though he should be present at those meetings, yes sir.

SENATOR SYAS: Well, OK, now, just a second. There may be
