

Alright now is there any further discussion of the motion? Any further discussion? Alright, Senator Lewis, you can close on your motion now, this is it.

SENATOR LEWIS: I'll make it in about two or three words. First of all, this is Wednesday. I've asked for Monday. I'm sure the Attorney General, in his wisdom, and his staff, can tell me easily if that's not constitutional and what's not constitutional about it and I promise you, if it's not constitutional, I'll be the first guy in line to change it so it is so that we can implement the bill to achieve its desired purpose but I want that bill moved up and I think it's a vital bill to this Legislature and it's a big money bill and I think that we ought to consider the money bills and I would almost want to consider it the same time as we do the budget. It's not a cheap bill, it's going to cost \$1,600,000 annually, to 1994 and I think that's going to have some impact and I suppose you're not supposed to reveal the cost but I think in perfect candor with you, that it is expensive and I want it considered. I want you to vote it up or down. I don't want it to die up there or wait another year. We've got some pro--people with some serious problems that this is going to correct so with that, Mr. President, I would certainly ask the members of this body to bracket that bill for me for Monday, the 16th.

PRESIDENT: Okay, the motion now is to bracket LB 445 for discussion first thing Monday, April 16th. All those in favor of the motion will vote aye. All those opposed will vote no. Chair would also rule in this instance that to bind the body to a future action like this would take 25 votes, not just a simple majority. Question is, have you all voted? Question is shall LB 445 be bracketed for discussion first thing Monday, April 16th? Suppose the Chair should clarify that's not the first thing Monday morning but when we get to general file.

SENATOR LEWIS: Mr. Chairman--

PRESIDENT: Yeah, okay. Have you all voted? Senator Lewis?

SENATOR LEWIS: I'd ask for a call of the house.

PRESIDENT: Very good. Clerk will clear the board. The next motion and the next bell will indicate your presence of a call of the house whether you support that motion or not. All those in favor will vote aye. All those opposed will vote no. This is a vote for call of the house. Okay. Have you all voted? Clerk will record.

CLERK: 23 ayes, 5 nays on call of the house.

PRESIDENT: Very good. We're under call of the house. Will the Senators please take their seats? The next bell please indicate your presence.

CLERK: Senator Anderson voting aye on the original motion.

PRESIDENT: Senator Anderson voting aye. Senator Stromer, we're under a call of the house. Senator Keyes voting aye. Senator Waldron voting aye. Senator Richendifer voting aye, Senator Richendifer, we're under a call of the house. Hey, come back. Alright, the motion is to raise the call. All those, all those in favor of raising the call, vote aye. All those opposed vote no. Motion is to raise the call. Clerk will record.

CLERK: 31 ayes to raise the call.
