of the Interstate. Now this is on a county road. Now does this bill give authority to that county to overrule the regulations of the State government?

SENATOR KEYES: Oh no. I'm sure that this would do nothing of the kind.

SENATOR WHITNEY: Thank you.

SPEAKER: Now Senator Dickinson.

SENATOR DICKINSON: Mr. Speaker, will Senator Keyes yield to a question, please.

SPEAKER: Senator Keyes.

SENATOR DICKINSON: This, I haven't, been glancing at this hurriedly, this doesn't mean that county boards can just arbitrarily declare the road or property has limited access to any given road, has to be in the line of development, new construction or widening of the right of way or something to this effect.

SENATOR KEYES: The only thing this will do is if some big company or factory came out and was going to set a factory up along a county road, that the county would have the same control over it as the State has over their roads right now. It wouldn't mean anything different.

SENATOR DICKINSON: Thank you.

SENATOR KEYES: Mr. President, I move for the advancement--

SPEAKER: Senator Nore.

SENATOR NORE: Mr. Chairman, fellow members. I think this is a highly controversial piece of legislation. If I wanted to set up some grain handling facilities along the edge of a county road, I'd have to get permission from the county board to put a culvert in and get access to the road, is that right, Senator Keyes?

SENATOR KEYES: Senator Nore, this will not do anything different. I think you're just dealing with a hypothetical case there that it doesn't exist.

SENATOR NORE: It's not hypothetical at all, it's real.

SENATOR KEYES: Well you will rob the right to the county for egress and so forth.

SENATOR NORE: And I don't want--

SENATOR KEYES: And you will be issued by the county just as it is right now.

SENATOR NORE: I don't want to give the county board--

SENATOR KEYES: Well the county board has that authority right now, Senator Nore.

SENATOR NORE: --that power.

SPEAKER: Is there any further discussion? I believe this is on the advancement of the bill, is that right, Senator Kremer? All those in favor of advancing the bill as amended vote aye. Those opposed vote no. This requires 25 votes. Clerk will record.
