

SENATOR STULL: Senator Marvel, originally that was my motion and I have no desire to upset what you did yesterday. The only thing, I cannot see any good reason to stockpile the final reading bills over there. I think if we're going to leave them on the board, they might as well be on general file as on final reading.

SENATOR MARVEL: So I would like to amend the motion if I might, Vince, to--

SPEAKER: Now we have an amendment--

SENATOR MARVEL: Alright.

SPEAKER: --to the amendment. I believe that's as far as we can go. Senator Duis, would you--

SENATOR DUIS: I, I'll withdraw my amendment.

SPEAKER: Withdraw your amendment and allow Senator Marvel to amend the amendment? Senator Marvel.

SENATOR MARVEL: My amendment simply would read that--consider bills on final reading that have no fiscal impact, period.

CLERK: --is what I understood Senator Stull just--

SENATOR MARVEL: --well, that isn't what your motion says--

CLERK: Well, I, I had written it for him and not him--

SENATOR MARVEL: Oh, okay.

CLERK: --I didn't understand what, exactly what he wanted, so that's how his motion--

SPEAKER: Is the amendment under--to the amendment understood then? Original amendment--alright. So there is no amendment--am I to understand there is no amendment to the amendment now? Senator Carpenter and then Senator Barnett.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Well, I--ask Senator Marvel another question.

SPEAKER: Senator Marvel, do you yield?

SENATOR CARPENTER: Are there other bills on final reading--final reading which would have a fiscal am--impact outside of A bills?

SENATOR MARVEL: Well I--by fiscal impact you, you get into this discussion. I have not analyzed the final reading but you get into this discussion as to whether we pass enabling legislation which, in effect, creates public policy and then we don't pass an A bill to fund it, so, so I don't know whether there are those bills or not. Technically, if you pass a bill that's got enabling legislation, you don't pass an A bill, I suppose it doesn't have fiscal impact. Eventually it would.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Well I, that's what I want to make--in other words, we, we can technically and legally pass a bill which is author--authorization and not pass the appropriation bill.

SENATOR MARVEL: Yes.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Obviously we cannot have two subjects in one bill. In this case if we did that, it would be ineffective because there would be no funding so no harm would be done either way.
