SPEAKER: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Speaker, could you inform me of just what is before us right now?

SPEAKER: Yes, we have--we had the Stull amendment, as I understand it to provide that we'll only pass or act on bills on final reading that have fiscal impact--

SENATOR CHAMBERS: --you mean that don't have--

SPEAKER: --then that was amended, that was amended by the Warner amendment which provides an exception as far as capital construction is concerned for buildings under construction. Now, now, Senator Stull, have I stated that correctly? Maybe Senator Stull will want to further amplify.

SENATOR STULL: Mr. Speaker, I'm not sure that I understood this correctly. It's bills other than the ones that has fiscal impact. Now I think we're confusing the issue a little bit. I think we should go ahead and take a--vote on the motion that I've made and amended by Senator Warner and then this other area of, of presenting a bill here on the capital construction, I think that's another subject and while it's somewhat related to Senator Warner's amendment, I think we should go ahead and vote on mine and then we can approach the other problem. Thank you.

SPEAKER: Senator Chambers, perhaps I mispoke, I meant to say; his mo--Senator Stull's motion is that we act on bills that do not have fiscal impact. That was amended by Senator Warner's amendment which we're on now.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: After we dispose of this amendment, this amended amendment one way or the other, would another motion be in order with reference to the same subject matter?

SPEAKER: Well I, I think it would be--

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, thank you.

SPEAKER: --it's a form of reconsideration. Well we have more lights on up here, the ones that haven't spoken, let's take them first unless there is a motion to cease debate. Senator Murphy.

SENATOR MURPHY: I wanted to ask Senator Syas a question if he'd yield.

SPEAKER: What he wants you to do.

SENATOR SYAS: How'd I get into this? Go ahead.

SENATOR MURPHY: Well, I want to know what the effective date of that closed crow season was. I think we may need one and I don't know whose name to put on it.

SENATOR SYAS: What was that again?

SENATOR MURPHY: I just wondered if we could take one crow out of season and don't put anybody's name on it yet.

SENATOR SYAS: Somebody I think, I don't know who it's going, who it's going to be, Senator Kelly, but somebody's going to eat crow after this is over and I hope it isn't the Legislature but that remains to be seen.
