PRESIDENT: The question is shall that be..motion be adopted. All those in favor will vote aye. All those opposed will vote no.

CLERK: There has been a request for a Roll Call vote, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: A Roll Call vote is requested.

CLERK: Roll Call vote taken.
