has something going in his favor with the people already that the Legislature does not have. I think that Senator Warner's motion might be a testing of the water and that's about all. It will not bind the Legislature. It won't bind us tomorrow because we can undo it. We can try to rescind what Senator Carpenter accomplished yesterday tomorrow. We can try to undo Senator Stahmer's motion that was adopted today tomorrow and I think we ought to do all of those things but I don't know whether we will or not. So here's what I would suggest--if you vote for Senator Warner's motion, this should be a vote against what Senator Carpenter did yesterday. It should also be a vote against 259 and it should be a vote in favor of us doing the realistic things as far as the expenditure of money is concerned that we know must be done.

SENATOR PROUD: Mr. President, will you please read the message from the Governor, have the Clerk read it?

PRESIDENT: Stand by, it's out to be Xeroxed. Is there any further discussion of the Warner motion? Senator Carpenter and then Senator Syas. Wait a minute. Would you yield?

SENATOR CARPENTER: Do we have a message from...

PRESIDENT: Pardon me, sir. Senator Murphy indicated he'd like to speak. Would you yield the floor to Senator Murphy? Thank you. Senator Murphy. Still speaking on the Warner motion here.

SENATOR MURPHY: Rather than have that thing Xeroxed, why don't we have it bronzed?

PRESIDENT: I appreciate your Irish humor. Senator Syas, did you wish to be recognized on the Warner motion here? We still have the Warner motion before us.

SENATOR SYAS: Yes, but, addressed to the chair and to the proposition ahead. If, I don't know what is in the Governor's message but it might make a difference on this vote. I'd like to know what's in the Governor's message before I vote and I think that's only fair. It might change my vote. I know right now how I'm going to vote but with, whatever, there might be something in that message to change my vote. I'm not exactly always--sometimes I'm with the Governor, sometimes not.

PRESIDENT: Thank you, the chair concurs in your position, Senator Syas, I agree.
