Moving it from general file to E&R initial. 311 is on select file, expedited and will be held there pending the arrival of an Attorney General's opinion. Thank you. The Clerk will record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, no nays--correction, 7 nays, and 17 not voting.

PRESIDENT: 311A is advanced.

CLERK: Mr. President, your committee in Enrollment Review reports (read)

PRESIDENT: Thank you. While the Legislature's in session and capable of transacting business, I am signing LB 179. While we're getting ready for final reading which is the next order of business here, we will clear the floor and ask the Senators to please get in their seats as has been ordered by the rules and while we're doing that, the Chair has a sad announcement to make this morning. Many of you, I'm sure, will remember Carl Christensen who worked in our Bill Room and also worked on the floor over there in the middle rows on the left hand side of the aisle and his burial services are being conducted today and I thought maybe the body would like to know that. Mr. Carl Christensen, we will miss him. Now, Senator Syas, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR SYAS: I move we not--we dispense with our usual order like we usually do and we use the rest of the day, point of personal privileges so we can get everything off our chests and then we can come back and start working.

PRESIDENT: Wait a minute--your motion was to suspend the rules and, and not follow the agenda for today, is that correct? Well now the Chair has your motion, are you in jesting or are you, are you serious? Well, I--well alright then, we'll not take that particular motion. First bill on final reading this morning--read the motion on the desk.

CLERK: Mr. President, I move that the--Senator Warner's motion and he's not here. The motion is, Mr. President, (read)

PRESIDENT: Beyond June--say it again, please.

CLERK: Beyond June 30th.

PRESIDENT: Okay. Chair recognizes Senator Warner. Well, Senator Syas, the Chair has a little difficulty--the Chair has a little difficulty this morning because as you may remember, we earlier considered Senator Whitney's motion on this bill and the body took action on that--311. Now then Senator Warner at that time mentioned that because of the implications of that bill that then his motion should receive some consideration. Now the Chair probably is not in a position to determine just right here, right now the implications of that and it seems to me like it's in proper order because of the unusual way in which we have proceeded and the Chair will take the blame for the alteration from the regular agenda because Senator Barnett had a problem with his resolution--he has to have it by 1:00 this afternoon. If we had waited in order to take up that resolution until later after we finished final reading, we might not have had the resolution, therefore, we had to open it to all the resolutions and the Chair apologizes for that but I don't think
