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SPEAKER: I'll ask Senator Marvel if he wishes to answer those questions. If he doesn't why then Senator--Chair recognizes Senator Carpenter in this regard.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I have no objection to it but what are we going to do? Does this mean that anybody can talk on this thing as long as they want to or not?

SPEAKER: The, the Chair rules that we have to go to final reading if this motion does not carry. I presume the Chair should recognize this motion.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I move the previous question--we'll determine it now.

SPEAKER: Previous question has been called for. Do I see 5 hands? I do. Therefore--

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I have a point of order, Mr. Chairman. I don't think the motion has even been discussed or explained by the one who

offered it so can the question be moved before--

SPEAKER: This means--this means you'll have the privilege of explaining your motion after voting on this.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: All I would have the opportunity to do is close in reality.

SPEAKER: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: How can I ask questions during my closing? Senator Carpenter's giving me the answers for the Chair but I don't think they'll be recorded because they're not being picked up by the machine. He said I could not ask any questions during closing.

SPEAKER: Senator Chambers, I recognize, you asked a question of the Chair and I recognized Senator Carpenter and he made this motion so I, I can't see how the Chair can go wrong on asking, since there's more than 5 hands, asking for the previous question. Senator Simpson.

SENATOR SIMPSON: Mr. President and Members of the body. I, I think it's highly unusual when you allow someone to get up and ask for a question but someone else already has the floor then they are in no position to make any motions. I think that you're going to have to take them in order; if you wish to recognize Senator Carpenter and he make his motion after Senator Chambers has spoken. In reality, Senator Chambers still has the floor and I think you ought to honor that.

SPEAKER: Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: (mike off)--be discourteous. Let Senator proceed and make his opening remarks. When he gets through I'll move the previous question then he can answer his own remarks.

SPEAKER: Thank you Senator Carpenter. Senator Marvel, did you wish to yield to questions or not?

SENATOR MARVEL: Yeah, I'll yield to questions.

SPEAKER: Okay, Senator--Chambers--
