CLERK: Reads bill.

SENATOR RICHENDIFER: Mr. President, I'd ask for a Call of the House.

PRESIDENT: Call of the House has been asked for. Clerk will clear the board.

SENATOR RICHENDIFER: Mr. President, if they're all here I'll withdraw that.

PRESIDENT: There's only one excused so there's only one absent so that--all right. Call of the House--pardon me, sir. What is your motion? Senator Richendifer. What is your pleasure?

SENATOR RICHENDIFER: Mr. President, I withdraw the motion. They're all here.

PRESIDENT: Senator Richendifer's withdrawing his motion.

CLERK: Senator Johnson voting aye on the original motion.

PRESIDENT: Senator Johnson voting aye. All right.

CLERK: Reads vote.

PRESIDENT: Senator Simpson.

SENATOR SIMPSON: Changing from no to aye.

PRESIDENT: Senator Simpson is changing from no to aye. Senator Lewis. Senator Lewis.

SENATOR LEWIS: F. Lewis voting no and R. Lewis voting yes.

PRESIDENT: Senator Warner, for what purpose do you rise? Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: I was rising to change my vote but I assume there are now 33, then I will not.

CLERK: 33 ayes, 15 nays, 1 not voting.

PRESIDENT: The bill is passed with the emergency clause attached. Senator Warner, did you wish to be recognized?

SENATOR WARNER: Yes, a point of personal privilege.

PRESIDENT: State your point, Senator.

SENATOR WARNER: I think, Mr. President, that I'd like to take just a couple of minutes an opportunity to make it clear what has not occurred this morning as well as perhaps what did occur.
