SPEAKER: Are you objecting, Senator Lewis?

SENATOR F. LEWIS: No I was just going to say that certainly out of acquisition to--acquiescence to Senator Warner's statement, I'll say that at the present time it appears that that research time was wasted.

SPEAKER: Since there are no objections, the motion to strike the enacting clause has been removed.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Mr. President, I move LB 452 as amended be advanced to E&R for Engrossing.

SPEAKER: You've heard the motion. Those in favor of advancing LB 452 say aye. Those opposed no. The bill is advanced.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Mr. President, I move the adoption of the E&R amendments--

SENATOR CARPENTER: It's a bill which I have an interest in so I ask the bill be bracketed if that's what it does. I move it be bracketed with all other A bills.

SPEAKER: Senator Carpenter's asked unanimous consent that LB 506A be bracketed on select file.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I have no objection to moving it to final reading and bracketed with the rest of the A bills on final reading, that may be more practical.
