SPEAKER: You're withdrawing your request at the moment?

SENATOR CARPENTER: Yes.

SPEAKER: Senator Cavanaugh, then you move the bill.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Mr. President, I move LB 506A be advanced to E&R--as amended, be advanced to E&R for Engrossing.

SPEAKER: Those in favor say aye. Those opposed no. The bill advances.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I ask the bill be bracketed.

SPEAKER: Senator Carpenter has asked unanimous consent that LB 506A be bracketed indefinitely.

CLERK: On E&R for Engrossing?

SPEAKER: E&R Engrossing. Right. Senator Marsh.

SENATOR MARSH: Mr. Speaker, I object to bracketing this on E&R. I even object to bracketing it on final reading so let's take a vote on it please.

SPEAKER: The Chair suggests that we wait and since there has been an objection, until it gets farther along before we bring up any other motions.

CLERK: Mr. President, there is a motion on the desk (read).

SPEAKER: Chair recognizes Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Mr. President, I only do this for the purpose of attempting to amend the bill with an amendment which I have been advised is necessary. Now I don't know whether they want to unbracket 311 and the--on select file and consider it with this amendment and other amendments, then attempt to move it on or not. Can I ask the Chair, you have an interest in this bill, what is your desire?

SPEAKER: I think it would be satisfactory.

SENATOR CARPENTER: To amend and then attempt to be consider-- I move for the adoption of the amendment, the Clerk read the amendment.

SPEAKER: First we have to unbracket the bill.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I ask unanimous consent to unbracket 311.

SPEAKER: Senator Carpenter asks unanimous consent to unbracket 311. Are there any objections? If not, it is so ordered. Then there are some E&R amendments that have never been adopted so Senator Cavanaugh, will you make that request to adopt the E&R amendments on LB 311?

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Mr. President, I move the adoption of the E&R amendments to LB 311.

SPEAKER: You've heard the motion. Those in favor say aye. Those opposed no. Motion carries. Now we're ready for--

CLERK: Okay now, Mr.--Senator Carpenter offers the following amendment (read)
