

SPEAKER: Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Mr. President, these are five tax bills that the Governor had introduced. They are highly important in their original state and I think ready and available for perfecting amendments which would have to do with consideration of the tax system as it now exists or might exist. I don't see how we can consider the appropriation, the spending of money, even the capital expenditures until we determine the fate of the five bills which is on the Clerk's desk in the full consideration and active debate of this problem. For that reason, I move the questions are to be set after 172 on Wednesday. 172 has already been set for that date. These are the Governor's tax bills.

SPEAKER: Then, are these on General File?

SENATOR CARPENTER: Yes sir.

SPEAKER: Well, all right. Do you want it tomorrow morning?

SENATOR SAVAGE: Fine.

SPEAKER: Well, wait a minute. We set the other five for tomorrow. Do you want to make your motion to consider it today?

SENATOR SAVAGE: I will make it today, yes.

SPEAKER: All right. Senator Carpenter.
