CLERK: I have one by Senator Carpenter, one by Senator Goodrich.

SPEAKER: There is a motion to adjourn.

CLERK: Well wait a minute, I've got to read some stuff in.

SPEAKER: Let's let the Clerk read some stuff in.

CLERK: Reads. Mr. President, I move we adjourn. Signed, Senator Wiltse.

SPEAKER: Motion is to adjourn until 9:00 a.m. tomorrow. All those in favor sayaye. Those opposed no. We stand adjourned.
