(Start Belt #8)

Clerk reading roll call.

SPEAKER: Senator Barnett.

SENATOR BARNETT: May, may I ask the question so that I might be able to vote? I was out of the room at the time. What's the question before the house?

SPEAKER: Yes you can vote. The question before the house is Senator Richard Lewis' motion to postpone further consideration of LB 312 until January of 1974.

SENATOR BARNETT: I vote no.

CLERK: Senator Barnett voting no. 22 ayes, 22 nays.

SPEAKER: Motion fails. We're now on Senator Goodrich amendments. Senator Goodrich. (mike off)--believe that's where we left off.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Okay, Mr. President and Members of the body then, it looks to me like we're still in the same position we were yesterday, we better get a compromise going here and it's for that reason that I renew my motion to strike the "two thousand" and insert "10,000" which gives some flexibility in the, all across the State as far as the location that they can pick, the small town areas can get out to their shopping centers. There is a, some, has been some discussion of the possibility of amending that to three miles and I would, whoever, whatever the pleasure of the body is, I have no objection to amending it to three miles if that would be more in keeping with the pleasure of the body but I would renew my motion to amend the bill with the greater flexibility.

SPEAKER: Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I move to amend the Senator's bill to three miles as he indicated he would accept and I would accept.

SPEAKER: Can you take care of that, Mr. Clerk? Alright now, let's read the Goodrich motion as amended by the Carpenter motion.

CLERK: Read.

SPEAKER: Sen--Senator--who would like to explain ju--Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President, Members of the Legislature. Would you read the motion as it stands now as the, as the, the bill proposed be amended by Senator Carpenter?

SPEAKER: Clerk will read. He just wants it reread.

CLERK: Reread.

SPEAKER: Senator Fred Car--or Senator Schmit first and then Senator Fred Carstens.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President and Members of the Legislature. I'm in a difficult position because this amendment as offered by Senator Carpenter, would solve the problem insofar as my bank is concerned. Now the question that I would like to ask if I could of Senator Murphy; would this amendment be sufficient that he could support the bill? Senator Murphy, do you yield?
