

CLERK: The amendment reads to amend the Goodrich amendment to read "three miles". Signed, Senator Carpenter.

SPEAKER: Do you understand that, Senator Epke? All right. Are you now ready for the question? The question is what is the question. The question is Senator Carpenter's amendment to Senator Goodrich...Senator Goodrich's amendment. If you want to adopt the Carpenter amendment to the Goodrich amendment vote aye. If you are opposed to it vote no. It requires a majority of those voting. Have you all voted. The clerk will record.

CLERK: 19 ayes, 15 nays, 15 not voting.

SPEAKER: The amendment is adopted. We are now back to the Goodrich amendment as amended by the Carpenter amendment. Anybody want to talk. Are you ready for the question? All those in favor of the Goodrich amended..amendment as amended vote aye. Those opposed vote no. Have you all voted? The clerk will record.

CLERK: 20 ayes, 18 nays.

SPEAKER: The motion passes. Any further amendments on the desk, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: None, Mr. President.

SPEAKER: Whose bill is this.

CLERK: Senator Schmit's.

SPEAKER: Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: I move the bill be advanced to E & R.

SPEAKER: Are you ready for the question? The question is shall the bill be advanced. This requires 25 votes. All those in favor vote aye. Those opposed vote no. This is to advance the bill, LB 312. We will leave this open for 30 seconds unless somebody makes a motion. Counting. Motion is to advance the bill, the banking bill, 312. Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: A Call of the House, Mr. President.

SPEAKER: A Call of the House has been requested. Do I see five hands. The clerk will clear the Board. All those in favor of placing the House under Call vote aye. Those opposed vote no. Have you all voted? The clerk will record.

CLERK: 22 ayes, 5 nays to go under Call.

SPEAKER: The House is under Call. Please record your presence. Please record your presence for the Call of the House. Sergeant at Arms, please find the missing members, wherever they may be. The House is under Call. Please keep your seats. Chairman of the Rules Committee, please go back to your seat, and Senator Schmit, the principal introducer. It takes one to know one. Senator Clark.

SENATOR CLARK: I move we raise the Call.

SPEAKER: Senator Schmit.
