CLERK: Motion is to reconsider our action in adopting the Frank Lewis amendment to the committee amendments on LB 172.

SPEAKER: Senator Barnett.

SENATOR BARNETT: I move for the adoption of this motion for the reasons that I explained before and I don't know if we need any repetition on this. I think it's a compromise move at this time because it's obvious that under the present circumstances with all of it going to one side, equalization instead of all to the other side of ADM which a certain group of people want that we're going to have to come down the middle and give a little and take a little and I know that's not going to meet with some of our people but I don't know what else we can do to get some state aid relief into the different parts of the state.

SPEAKER: Senator Syas.

SENATOR SYAS: Senator Barnett, Lincoln generally comes out pretty good on this formulas I've always noticed. Just how do you stack up on paid in and get out on this thing?

SENATOR BARNETT: I couldn't answer that. I don't have the figures in front of me.

SENATOR SYAS: Well, you'd better have and...

SENATOR BARNETT: I'm sure I can get them for you.

SENATOR SYAS: I'd like to know that before this vote is taken. Senator Warner, you generally figure--these things come out pretty good for Lincoln. How does this one come out?

SENATOR WARNER: Based on Senator Lewis' figures that he has passed out, the amendment as proposed would result in a reduction in terms of dollars of about \$270,000.

SENATOR SYAS: How much did you pay in and get back?

SENATOR WARNER: Well, Senator Syas, I don't believe we spent last summer many hours trying to substantiate the amount of tax dollars, income and sales tax, paid by different communities. Now the only figure that you can get is a countywide figure.

SENATOR SYAS: That's good enough.

SENATOR WARNER: No, it is not in relation to a school district.
