CLERK: 27 ayes, 10 nays on motion to adopt the committee amendments as amended.

SPEAKER: The committee amendments--as amended?

CLERK: By the Warner amendment, right.

SPEAKER: Fine, by the Warner amendment. The committee amendments are adopted. Senator Lewis.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: Mr. Chairman, I move that the bill be moved to Select File.

SPEAKER: I'm assuming, Mr. Clerk, there are no further amendments?

CLERK: There are no further amendments on the desk, Mr. President.

SPEAKER: All right. Are you ready for the question? All right, the question is, shall the bill as amended be advanced? All those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Clerk will record.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 11 nays, 10 not voting.

SPEAKER: The vote is advanced. Senator Nore's button malfunctioned, he is recorded as voting aye. Senator Johnson had a matter here that may be of some pressing importance I feel we must take up before we adjourn. Senator Johnson.

CLERK: Mr. President, the motion is, I move that the Clerk be directed to request that the Governor return to the Legislature LB 180 for further consideration. Signed, Senator Johnson.

SPEAKER: Senator Johnson.

SENATOR JOHNSON: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, I called to the Governor's office this morning and he informed me that he could not agree to sign 180 in its present form and sent me a letter to that effect this afternoon and so I am asking that the Clerk bring the bill back to the Legislature and be reconsidered and I understand that this is the last day so I appreciate your action today.

SPEAKER: Senator Johnson, it's your understanding that apparently the Governor will veto this bill unless we bring it back here and take another look at it?

SENATOR JOHNSON: That's right, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER: Now if we bring it back, it's the chair's understanding we have several days to consider that, so at this point in time if we just request it back from the Governor's office apparently that is all we will have to do with it this afternoon. Is that correct, Senator Johnson?

SENATOR JOHNSON: That's my understanding, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER: You had your light on, Senator Skarda. Pass. Are you ready for the question? The question is, or the motion is to bring back--is it LB 180, Senator Johnson?
