SPEAKER: Like Senator Cavanaugh had a request.

SENATOR MAHONEY: Right.

SPEAKER: So I think--

SENATOR MAHONEY: I'll explain quickly with my bill is. The bill is the personnel, the State classification pay for the employees of the State. It's necessary that we get it up sometime now so that we can act on it so that if we do get this bill one way or other decided that it's going to be passed or not passed. Senator Luedtke would explain his problem and if you would, I don't see any problem with Senator Luedtke's bill coming before this.

SPEAKER: Senator Luedtke's is for a date certain, I believe.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: No, no, I, 573 I just asked to be put behind the one, the ones that are set for general file today.

CLERK: What your request is to set LB 573 after 580 which is bracketed for May 3rd.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Well, that's today, isn't it? What I meant, what I meant was that I didn't want to go ahead of those that have already been bracketed for today and I don't think any of these will be, will they?

SPEAKER: It's the Chair's ruling that unless we understand otherwise, if you make a motion to move your bill up, it, it, it's going to take its turn if, if there are motions ahead of that to put it in to--top of general file, then that will take precedence, now that's open interpretation because when you say I want to put a bill at the top of general file, that's ordinarily where it would go but I received so many requests, it seems to me that the ones who ask first should have their bill heard first. Do you agree with that, Senator Luedtke?

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Yeah, that's exactly why I made my motion the way I did and when, but when Senator Mahoney brought up his bill, I would prefer and I'm asking that, that this bill go ahead of Senator Mahoney's bill, 573 ahead of his. That's all I'm asking.

SPEAKER: Alright, so ordered. Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Well now I've got five or six bills there that are really important. Now let me ask Senator Mahoney a question. How much is this bill of yours going to cost if it's passed, if anything?

SENATOR MAHONEY: First, Senator Carpenter, let me be correct with you. It is not my bill but I am in favor of this bill. I'm sure that Senator Lewis and Senator Cavanaugh have the figures on this.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Well, let me ask them.

SPEAKER: Senator Cavanaugh;

SENATOR CARPENTER: What will this bill, 545 pass, cost if passed?

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: I don't believe there's a fiscal impact with this bill, Senator Carpenter. It institutes that the pay scales as I understand it and that money, as I would understand it, is already in the budget for the various pay scales. Senator Marvel, do you know any different. than that?
