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someone else and go in competition with private enterprise. I'm completely against it.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: It's my be--go in competition by leasing office space?

SENATOR CLARK: Yes.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: I don't understand how they'd be going in competition...

SENATOR CLARK: I mean to lease it out to other people. I understand that's what they're going to attempt to do if they buy the First National Bank building because it's too big for what they need at the present time.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: In addition to the consolidation of these facilities, the State is also considering an adult education center, an extension of the University of Nebraska in Omaha for which they project they will need, I think, an additional 30,000 feet within the next two years for that facility.

SENATOR CLARK: Well, the thing is, I don't want them to get into the business of going against private enterprise and renting out space. I don't think the State of Nebraska should be in a position of leasing space to someone else.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: My understanding--that is not my understanding of what they are contemplating doing and it is, I have no firm reason to believe that the First National Bank or any other building in Omaha has been decided on as the location for this consolidation. And I have questioned them extensively on this, Senator Clark.

PRESIDENT: Are you through, Senator Clark?

SENATOR CLARK: Yes.

PRESIDENT: Okay. Next chair recognizes Senator Stahmer and then Mahoney and then Duis.

SENATOR STAHMER: Mr. President, would Senator Cavanaugh yield to a question?

PRESIDENT: Will you yield again, Senator?

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Yep.

SENATOR STAHMER: You mention in the resolution either to lease and/or purchase a building. Are there funds set aside some place for a purchase and if so where and if there are not funds for the purchase, where will the funds for the purchase come from?

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: The bulk of the funds for the purchase and/or consolidated lease or lease/purchase or whatever type of arrangements they determine will come from the present funds that they are expending on the leasing of all these other facilities that we're presently engaged in leasing from.

SENATOR STAHMER: Well, for instance, you mention the moving from the University of Nebraska at Omaha downtown, their extension, not extension, their continuing education. Where would the monies for that come from?
