PRESIDENT: Please come to order. We'll have prayer by the Chaplain.

CHAPLAIN: Prayer given.

PRESIDENT: Roll call. We will need to discover all of the Senators that we can this morning I feel. May we have you register your presence please. Once again, have you all registered your presence? Clerk will record.

CLERK: Quorum present, Mr. President. Excuse me,

PRESIDENT: Are there corrections?

CLERK: Yes, Mr. President (read). That's all, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Are there other corrections from the floor? If not, the Journal will stand as corrected.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Kime asked to be excused today at noon and on Monday, May 7th until he returns.

PRESIDENT: Are there objections to Senator Kime's absence? Hearing none, so ordered. Do we have any notices of committee hearings or reports?

CLERK: Have some reports, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Read the reports.

CLERK: Reports read. That's all, Mr. President. We do have a request by Senator Syas to print certain amendments in the Journal relative to LB 432.

PRESIDENT: So ordered. Do we have any resolutions on the desk?

CLERK: None.

PRESIDENT: Are there any bills for introduction?

CLERK: None.

PRESIDENT: We have two, two bills apparently here on select file. Is Senator Cavanaugh in the chamber? Senator Stull, Senator Stull, could I prevail upon your generosity here to handle two bills on select file? Chair recognizes Senator Stull.

SENATOR STULL: Mr. President, I move that the amendments to 312 be adopted.

PRESIDENT: Motion is to adopt the amendments to LB 312, Senator Carpenter, is there a need for discussion? Senator Skarda, any discussion? Senator Schmit, discussion on the amendments to 312? Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President and Members of the Legislature, I would, I would oppose adoption of those amendments at this time. I don't think, could it be possible to pass that over until Monday, could we hold it on select file until Monday? Or should we just take--
