PRESIDENT: The Chair hasn't done anything with your bill this morning, only just try to move it from select file on with the E&R amendments so whatever it was the other day--at least, this occupant of the Chair is not at fault.

SENATOR GOODRICH: The original Schmit motion would have stricken the Goodrich-Carpenter motion which in turn would have placed the bill back in its original form except for the committee amendments which didn't really change the bill at all--

PRESIDENT: --and which has now been withdrawn--

SENATOR GOODRICH: Right. So, had Schmit's motion been presented, the bill would have been back in its original form with the exception of the changing of the wording within the corporate limits, which didn't change the bill at all, it just reworded the wording in that particular part of the bill.

PRESIDENT: No comment.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Thank you. Now all we have to do is decide what we're going to do with the Schmit motion and if he's--

PRESIDENT: No--he's withdrawn his motion, Senator Goodrich.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Okay.

PRESIDENT: So I think we're all set.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Objection to that has been raised and he can withdraw it.

PRESIDENT: That's correct, we did have an objection but we I think we dissolved the objection and now that motion is withdrawn and we have LB on 312 and the E&R amendments have been adopted. Now we want to move LB 312 on unless there is another motion to it.

CLERK: Now Mr. President, I have a motion to amend LB 312 as follows: (read)

PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Mr. President, what this amendment does, it says that each incorporated area in the State of Nebraska is entitled to at least one state bank charter after it has complied with all the laws pertaining to the issuing of bank charters. I move for its adoption.

PRESIDENT: That's the motion before the body. Senator Goodrich.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Senator Carpenter yield to a question, please?

PRESIDENT: Senator Carpenter, will you yield?

SENATOR CARPENTER: Certainly.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Senator Carpenter, I'm not objecting or raising an issue on your amendment at all.. What I'm trying to do is establish in my own mind what this amendment does that is not provided already in State statute. Now it's my
