CLERK: Not by E & R amendment.

PRESIDENT: Not by E & R amendment.

CLERK: All it does is polish the other amendments into the bill.

PRESIDENT: All right. Senator Goodrich, I am extremely reluctant to call on you but go ahead.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Just kind of restate for Senator Dickinson's benefit. As I understand it in this bill right now, a bank can have two detached facilities anywhere within the city limits of the town that their charter is located in as long as they don't go more than three miles from the original parent bank. So, they can have two detached facilities anywhere they want to as long as they stay, number one, within the corporate limits of the town, number two, within three miles of their charter location. Does that clear it up for you?

PRESIDENT: Thank you, Senator Goodrich. Senator Murphy.

SENATOR GOODRICH: If anybody disagrees with that, please let me know.

PRESIDENT: All right. Senator Murphy, we actually don't have anything before the body.

SENATOR MURPHY: Yes, we do.

PRESIDENT: Go ahead. For what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR MURPHY: In reply to Senator Dickinson. What it has done is eliminated the old 2600 ft. clause that all banks to date have abided by, so we now have set those banks at a complete disadvantage to any other bank. The new limitations will be one within three miles and one anywhere in town, if I understand this thing properly which means the banks that have built in accordance with the laws of the state of Nebraska have now had it.

PRESIDENT: Senator Skarda, for what purpose did you wish to be recognized?

SENATOR SKARDA: Senator Dickinson, a question. Senator, do you make reference to everybody...are you...that you're concerned that you have...that you make statements to the bill that you're unfamiliar with what the contents are, are you referring to everybody in the body?

SENATOR DICKINSON: I'm sorry. I don't understand, Senator Skarda.

SENATOR SKARDA: You made a reference. You said everybody don't know what the contents of the bill is.

SENATOR DICKINSON: No, I said..

SENATOR SKARDA: Are you talking for yourself or are you talking for me or everybody? That's what I want to know.

SENATOR DICKINSON: I said if that if everybody else understand it, I'll sit down. If anyone else misunderstands it as I do...and I've gotten two answers from two people who are vitally interested in this bill.

SENATOR SKARDA: Well, if you'd stay in your seat maybe you would find out instead of jacking around the room while others of us are listening.

SENATOR DICKINSON: Senator Skarda, I just proved my point. These two gentlemen are both vitally interested in this bill and they gave me two different answers to the question.
