Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I have a question I would like to ask Senator Snyder, if he would yield?

PRESIDENT: Senator Snyder, will you yield to a question?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Snyder, without withdrawing your kill motion, would you be opposed to allowing this to come up maybe Monday or Tuesday or at the next opportunity and give a chance for some of the...for some clarification as to exactly what the bill in the form with the Stahmer amendment would do and what the bill without the Stahmer amendment would do and the affect on elections in Class III districts in both cases.

SENATOR SNYDER: Fine with me but as I read the Board, everybody is kind of disgruntled with it.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: All right. Then, let it fly or crash.

SENATOR SNYDER: I don't care. Senator Nore, it is your bill.

PRESIDENT: Senator Nore.

SENATOR NORE: There is nothing wrong with 435 as it was originally drafted and let's not kill this bill. Let's strike the Stahmer amendment. I say again, let's pass it on General File. It's a good bill. That's all I can.. it's that simple, that's all I can say.

PRESIDENT: Just a minute. Senator Kelly, did you wish to be heard on this issue. The motion is to indefinitely postpone 435. That's the motion before the body at this time. Senator Duis. Senator Duis.

SENATOR DUIS: Mr. President, Senator Snyder, the bill in its original form only concerns a school district of which more than half lies in a metropolitan area, is that not correct?

PRESIDENT: Senator Snyder.

SENATOR SNYDER: Geographical..geographical, you're speaking of, yes.

SENATOR DUIS: Yes. In other words, that's all the bill concerns which apparently is just one school district. I would suggest, then, probably, if I might to you that is what would be wrong with the bill in its original form. Is it going to hurt District 66 tremendously, or something?

SENATOR SNYDER: Senator Duis, the problem is, at least as them sitting around me have said, with that Stahmer amendment..

SENATOR DUIS: Well, what I'm trying..

SENATOR SNYDER: (inaudible) elections are completely fouled up.

SENATOR DUIS: Yes, but I'm saying instead of the kill motion, if you ask the bill returned back to Select File to strike the Stahmer amendment, then if your motion would carry, then the bill would be in its original form which would only affect District 66 and wouldn't affect any other Class III school district. Is that not correct?

SENATOR SNYDER: All right. I will put it this way. Mr. President, I'll remove..I'll remove my motion to indefinitely postpone. It is Senator Nore's bill and at this stage I'll say
