on. Alright, question is shall 311 be advanced from select file to E&R Engrossing? All those in favor say aye. Those opposed say no. So ordered, the bill is advanced. Senator Carpenter, what's your, sen--what's your pleasure regarding 311A then, sir?

SENATOR CARPENTER: Just leave it like it is.

PRESIDENT: Alright. Do we have any other motions on the desk then for anything on select file?

CLERK: Mr. President, we have a request to bracket 47? for May 10.

PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator Whitney.

SENATOR WHITNEY: Mr. President, I just talked to Senator Carpenter. He has no objection to unbracketing 311A, letting it go across and then holding it on final reading. I ask unanimous consent to unbracket 311A.

PRESIDENT: Senator Whitney is asking unanimous consent to unbracket 311A. Any objections to unbracketing 311A? Senator Duis, do you have an objection?

SENATOR DUIS: I was going to say that I, I believe this will be necessary, that 311 if it's over there, cannot go anyplace without 311A and, of course, 311A is the funding bill and if, under the present situation, 311A would have to ask to have it withdrawn or killed if you want to pass 311.

PRESIDENT: Alright, the motion is to unbracket 311A. Are there objections? Hearing none, so ordered, the bill is unbracketed. Senator Whitney, back to you.

SENATOR WHITNEY: I move that 311A be advanced to E&R Engrossing.

PRESIDENT: There is a motion now to advance 311A. Is there a need for discussion? Question is shall the bill be advanced? All those in favor vote--say aye. Those opposed say no. It is so ordered, 311 is advanced to E&R final. Any other motions now to unbracket bills? Or anything to do with select file?

CLERK: None, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Do you want to move on to the confirmation here, the appointments?

CLERK: Yes. This is the Committee on Committee's reports found on page 1489 of the Legislative Journal. (read)

PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator Barnett.

SENATOR BARNETT: Mr. President, would you want to take these one at a time or can we try taking them all at once?

PRESIDENT: Senator Whitney has been making a motion that--

SENATOR BARNETT: --unanimous consent if we could take them all at once, it would be better.

PRESIDENT: That's correct. Make your motion.

SENATOR BARNETT: I mak--I'd move that, have unanimous consent to consider all three.
