SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President and Members of the Legislature. I have no closing.

PRESIDENT: Question is, shall LR 23 be indefinitely postponed? All those in favor vote aye. Senator Goodrich, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR GOODRICH: Request a record vote.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. Record vote has been requested. Question is, shall LR 23 be indefinitely postponed? All those in favor will vote aye. All those opposed will vote no. Have you all voted? Clerk will record.

CLERK: Roll call vote. 4 ayes, 33 nays, 12 not voting.

PRESIDENT: Motion to indefinitely postpone is lost. Senator Savage for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR SAVAGE: Mr. President, I, I, I move that the bill be advanced to E&R.

PRESIDENT: We have another amendment on it, sir, we can't do that because we have the Lewis amendment to the bill. Is there any other business to come before the body here?

CLERK: We have a motion to recess. I have a communication from the Executive Office.

PRESIDENT: Read the communication from the Executive.

CLERK: Read.

PRESIDENT: Senator Savage, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR SAVAGE: (mike off)--pretty fast there, I, I--

PRESIDENT: What was it, sir?

SENATOR SAVAGE: Well, I'd like to move that the Lewis amendment be rejected until it goes on select file.

PRESIDENT: Senator Savage. Senator Savage, my apologies to you if you felt that I did something improperly. We have a motion to recess until 2:00 and that motion and that motion takes--

SENATOR SAVAGE: --That was not before I was,

PRESIDENT: --over everything else, period!

SENATOR SAVAGE: not before I was up.

PRESIDENT: That isn't even debatable at this particular time. Now is there any other business to come before the body?

SENATOR SAVAGE: Now wait a minute, WAIT A MINUTE, I was on my feet here talking and you cut me off before that motion was made.

PRESIDENT: Pardon me, Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I move the motion to recess be rejected.

PRESIDENT: Alright, the motion is to recess until 2:00 this
