CLERK: 7 ayes, 26 nays.

PRESIDENT: Alright, the motion to recess is lost. We still have before us then LR 26--excuse me, 23. Now Senator Nore, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR NORE: Mr. President, I, I would ask for unanimous consent to advance LB 435 to final reading to save the cost of reprinting.

PRESIDENT: Senator Nore, you're out of order, we can't take that motion up at this particular time. You'll have to wait. We have before us LR 23 at this particular time and we now have the Lewis amendment amendment to LR 23. Now then, Senator Savage, did you have further comment, sir?

SENATOR SAVAGE: Yes, I move the Lewis amendment be rejected and place and that LR 23 be advanced to select file..

PRESIDENT: Thank you. We --

SENATOR SAVAGE: --E&R initial.

PRESIDENT: Very good. Now we have the Lewis amendment which is being debated at this particular time before the body. Now, Senator Frank Lewis.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: Mr. Chairman, I think that the procedure here is a little highly unusual, particularly since the amendment's not on our desk. We don't know what it says, we don't know anything about it. The introducer of the amendment certainly isn't present so that has not been explained. I would suggest to you that, I thought our original intent was to review the amendment. I thought Senator Kennedy was going to handle it later this afternoon so I would think that maybe we're getting in just a little bit a hurry. I want to see this resolution go myself but I don't think the procedure is right. I think you're stampeding.

PRESIDENT: Alright, now, thank you, Senator Lewis. I'm going to call on Senator Goodrich next but I'm going to also mention I have six lights on and I haven't the foggiest idea what order they came on because I, of course, was engaged in other activities. Unless you get on your feet at the same that you punch lights on when I'm involved, it's pretty hard to keep track of who wants to speak next. I'm going to recognize Senator Goodrich. We still have before the body Senator Lewis' amendment to LR 23. That's the sole issue before the body at this time. Now, Senator Goodrich.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Two things: Number 1: I'd like to clarify what Senator Savage's amendment is, what his motion is. Number 1, he is saying in essence, his motion rejects the Lewis amendment, but does his motion also include moving the resolution to E&R initial or has that been dropped off of it? Is it just a motion to reject the Lewis amendment? If that is the case because I, it's my understanding, Senator Savage that we don't advance this resolution to E&R initial. We just adopt the resolution at this point and then we're through with it and that accomplishes the end we're after. I certainly have no qualms about supporting Senator Savage's motion to reject the Lewis amendment because Senator Lewis can put that--offer that amendment again on select file so we're not losing anything
