SENATOR CHAMBERS: The easiest thing might be to go ahead and try to take a vote. I'm being advised to try to move it so that's what I'll do and if it doesn't get enough votes, it will remain on General File anyway.

PRESIDENT: All right, any further discussion now of the bill? I still have some lights left on, Senator Skarda, do you need to be recognized again? Thank you. Senator Schmit, are you wishing to be recognized again? The question is, shall LB 315 be advanced from General File to E & R Initial? All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote no. The motion before us is to advance LB 315 from General File to E & R Initial. All those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote no. Thank you. Wait a minute, just a minute. Senator Schmit, did you want to vote on the issue here? Motion is the advancement of LB 315. Clerk will record.

CLERK 29 ayes, 2 nays, 18 not voting.

PRESIDENT: Okay, the bill is advanced. Senator Stromer asked to be excused for the balance of the day. Are there any objections? Hearing none, so ordered. We'll move to the General File--pardon me, was there other business on the desk?

CLERK: I have some requests to juggle bills.

PRESIDENT: Well, just a moment here. Now I'll take them up as they come in but the order has already been set for a little while here. The next bill to be heard would be LB 299 which is Senator Warner's bill. Senator Warner, what is your pleasure regarding the bill? Okay. Read the bill. Just before we read the bill let's, the chair would like to announce that we have in the north balcony from Senator Cal Carsten's district 11 first through eighth grade students from District 53, Otoe County and they are from Nebraska City, 11 students, 4 mothers and Mrs. Mardell Seybert is the instructor and we're delighted to have you here today as observers to the Nebraska Unicameral Legislature. Okay, the Clerk will read the bill please.

LB 299.

CLERK: Reads title of LB 299. There are committee amendments by Senator Snyder's Urban Affairs Committee.

PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator Snyder.

SENATOR SNYDER: Mr. President, I'd move for the adoption of the Urban Affairs committee amendments to LB 299. The amendments were provided from City Attorney Ralph Nelson of Lincoln.
