SENATOR DUIS: I understand you didn't and I am not being critical of you. I am trying to bring out a point that this Committee was..constantly was..the camouflaging of patrol. Now, all of a sudden with the threat of a veto, we are just chilled in here and I don't think we should be that way.

SENATOR BARNETT: Well, a lot of these things can be taken care of administratively that we've talked about.

PRESIDENT: Could the chair respectfully suggest that we debate just the Barnett amendment, or else let's do something with it. Then, if you want to do something with the bill, fine, but I'd like to bring the discussion here to some sort of a conclusion. Senator Lewis, do you want to speak on something else rather than the Barnett amendment? Let's dispatch the Barnett amendment. Does anybody else now want to talk about the Barnett amendment to LB 45 on Select File. All right. Senator Barnett, do you want to close on your amendment? The question is shall the amendment be adopted? All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote no. Voting on the Barnett amendment. Thank you. The clerk will record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, 23 not voting.

PRESIDENT: All right. The Barnett amendments are adopted. Now, we still have 45 on Select File. Now, Senator Lewis, did you want to point some direction for the bill or make a motion regarding the bill?

CLERK: We still have some more amendments on the bill, also.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. There are more amendments pending on LB 45. Senator Richard Lewis.

SENATOR RICHARD LEWIS: Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, I would think that Senator Skarda has a very good suggestion. I was a member of the Committee that heard this bill. I think the bill is in good shape. There is no flaws in it as far as I know but I would like to...and while his reference to uniform commercial code does go back more than the one session, it's constantly presenting problems and I think it is a case of where we have to accept a huge volume of words just without really knowing what's in them and I think he has a very good suggestion in offering to hold this bill until the next session and I would make that move.

PRESIDENT: Your motion, now, is to hold this bill until the next session on Select File right where it is at. Is that the motion?

SENATOR LEWIS: I would like to bracket it on Select File until the next session.

PRESIDENT: The Lewis motion now is to bracket LB 45 on Select File right where it is at. Senator Barnett.

SENATOR BARNETT: Well, Mr. President, that seems to be one of the most ridiculous moves I have ever heard of, especially from one of the members of the Committee who had plenty of time to make input into the bill and to do exactly what he is trying to do. I can see no reason at all to hold up on this bill. None, whatsoever. I think it is a ridiculous motion because it doesn't go into effect until January 1st of next year anyway.
