CLERK: Well, we--

PRESIDENT: We'll have the Schmit amendment then as amended.

CLERK: I understood what you were doing was moving to amend the Schmit amendment by striking his amendment and inserting the first paragraph of your amendment.

PRESIDENT: Senator Goodrich.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Wo--would you wake the girl up? Okay. That's exactly right, but that's not the way Frank was saying it. Now if that's exactly right, why we got no problem.

CLERK: Now you need to adopt the Schmit amendment--

PRESIDENT: Alright.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Right, which is now my amendment in--his amendment is exactly the same one we just voted on before.

PRESIDENT: We're now voting then next on the Schmit amendment as amended. Is there any further discussion? Question is then, shall the Schmit amendment as amended be adopted? All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote no. You are now voting on the Schmit amendment as amended by Senator Goodrich. Thank you. Clerk will record. Clerk will record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, no nays, 23 not voting to adopt the Schmit amendment as it's amended by the Goodrich amendment.

PRESIDENT: Alright now we have that. Now we have the second half of the Goodrich amendment still pending someplace here.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Right and that's what I just explained a couple of minutes ago. This is the one, the ownership of stock in a--organization where the principal source of business is not the liquor license but the liquor license is just incidental to the business like United Air Lines or something like that. I don't feel that police officers are second class citizens and they should not be limited so that they could not own stock in a corporation such as United Air Lines or railroads or something like that. I move the adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDENT: Alright, at least we got that part of it separated out, Senator Goodrich, as a separate issue. Now, before we move into that, Chair would like to recognize that we have 32 Kindergartners through the Eighth Grade from Rural 23 of Omaha. There are 8 adults up there also with them. They're in the South Balcony. Mrs. Barry Nowak is the instructor and they're from Senator Dickinson's area; additionally, seated, I believe in the North Balcony from Senator Anderson's district is 42 Seventh and Eighth Grade Students from the Hildreth Jr. High at Hildreth, Nebraska. Superintendent is Stanton Smith and Roger Payne is the instructor up there. We're delighted to have you here today to watch the activities here of the Nebraska Unicameral Legislature. We almost got ourselves tangled up in some parliamentary procedure here a minute ago but I think I see a way out of the
