PRESIDENT: Senator Chambers, do you want to defer your motion to Senator Carpenter's motion then to place the bills at the head of General File, ahead of I presume 533? Right? Are there objections to placing that series of bills, 549 through 562, at the head of General File? We have, Senator Carpenter, we have a little complication involving 533 in that the chair had already tentatively ruled that if we could possibly go through the three bills scheduled for today that 533 would be next. Would you be willing to put those bills after 533 at the head of General File?

SENATOR CARPENTER: Any place...

PRESIDENT: Wait just a minute. We may have another problem here. Senator Syas.

SENATOR SYAS: Well, I'm not trying to give you problems but the point was and I think Senator Burbach asked for it, that since we have the Budget Committee out that they didn't want 533 taken up at all in their absence. I thought that was the agreement.

PRESIDENT: Well, it was the chair's understanding that they would be notified, Senator Syas, that--it was the chair's understanding that we would not debate 533 until we had notified the Budget Committee.

SENATOR SYAS: That's right.

SENATOR CARPENTER: These are ahead of 533.

SENATOR SYAS: Yes, that's all right. I'm not kicking about that but somebody wanted to do something else, put 533 ahead of something else.

PRESIDENT: Stand by. Senator Burbach, do you object to having this series placed ahead of 533?

SENATOR BURBACH: No, this is fine, this is what I think was the agreement and I think this is the proper place for them.

PRESIDENT: Now wait a minute. Ahead of 533 or behind 533?

SENATOR BURBACH: No, ahead of it.

PRESIDENT: Oh, okay, that's fine then.

SENATOR BURBACH: That's what Senator Carpenter asked for and that's the right place for it.

PRESIDENT: Good, I wanted to protect your position in line here. All right then the motion is to place 549 through 562 at the head of General File. Are there objections to placing the bills up there? Senator Chambers, are you objecting?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Not objecting, Mr. President, but just a note of warning or information. These bills were just reported out today and the amendments are not in your bill book so if you wanted to delay it so you could get those amendments, or you could just pass them as they were amended.
