SENATOR MARESH: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, what this does it protects the students from being disqualified for admission to a training program and, also, protects them while in training. We provide in Section 13 and Section 14, we protect the hospital and the people involved in the hospital from being forced to perform, take part in abortions and I feel it should be studied further, so I want to ask for unanimous consent that LB 286 be passed by and this be printed in the Journal and get our reaction on this amendment.

SPEAKER: Are there any objections to the unanimous consent motion on LB...the motion does. You cannot ask for unanimous consent on Select File, Senator Mares, so you will have to move..

SENATOR MARESH: I move that LB 286 be held over...

SPEAKER: The clerk informs me that this can be done. Are there any objections to holding over LB 286 on Select File until tomorrow and that the amendment that Senator Mares has offered be printed in the Journal. Any objections? If not, so ordered. Next is LB 172.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 172, the E & R amendments have been adopted. The bill was laid over on March 4th. Again on March 7th, again on May 4...correction, May 4th, May 7th, May 8th.

SPEAKER: Senator Cavanaugh.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: I would yield to Senator Lewis if he wants to move it today. I don't know where he is, though. I move we pass over it, at least, until he gets back in the chamber.

SPEAKER: Senator Cavanaugh has asked unanimous consent to pass over LB 172. If there are no objections, so ordered.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Mr. President, I move the adoption of the E & R amendments to LB 423.

SPEAKER: Motion to adopt the E & R amendments on 423. Those in favor say aye. Those opposed say no. The amendments are adopted.

CLERK: Ok. Now, Mr. President, there are some amendments pending by Senator Goodrich. I move the adoption of the attached amendment to LB 423. Read.

SPEAKER: The chair recognizes Senator Goodrich.

SENATOR GOODRICH: OK. Mr. President, members of the body, on LB 423, there was an amendment which, in essence, was to clarify the language in the bill. The question was whether or not it was clearly set out in the bill that the Omaha Technical Community Schools could continue managing their own retirement funds. The Omaha retirement fund..the school..the Omaha School District retirement fund is managed by the Omaha School District. The governing board of the Technical Community College is, Technical Community College of Omaha and the public school district of Omaha are one and the same governing board. Consequently, we wanted to spell out in the LB 423 that they could continue to manage their retirement fund as it pertained to the Technical School in Omaha, the Omaha Technical Community College in Omaha and in Committee we brought this up and there was some question on the part of Senator Luedtke relative to whether or not the Lincoln School system wanted to be included in it and, consequently, after..we advanced the bill without the amendment and we have subsequently contacted the Lincoln School
