100%. I think it is ridiculous what we've done for them in the past. I understand that she will get \$270.00 a month until like I said before, until she chooses, if she does and I know it is touchy to talk about this, but if she does choose to remarry, or the children obtain a certain age. It makes no difference whether this benefit is comes under the heading of the false or the not false but the bad situation that this man came under, he was a young trooper, in the prime of life, been on patrol about three years. As I understand it, we do not have a decent pension system, or a decent system set up for people that ask and volunteer to risk their lives, for salary, for the people in the State of Nebraska. Senator Skarda, I would say that your absolutely right, it is paltry I think something needs to be done in this area. I've even considered having a resolution drawn to completely check into and study the administration, the trooper job, the retirements and everything that we have for these State patrolmen. Now it is true, they do come and ask for a job, but then it seems after we do this and we want them to work for us, they sometimes we sometimes forget that their out there, and their out there alone and this is what happened in this case. The patrolman was alone, pulled two innocent looking people over and it resulted in his death. It is not pleasant to talk about and I would certainly agree with you that something probably should be done other than this and I hope I've answered your questions to the best of my ability.

SPEAKER: Senator Goodrich.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Mr. President, members of the body, I just wanted to bring some additional information to you. The, when this bill was first brought to my attention, I decided to check to find out what life insurance benefits were available to troopers. There are two programs that are available to troopers one of which is a family type life insurance program, where they can get as much as \$10,800 worth of insurance on themselves for \$6.00 a month. They can also add their families which would add a \$1,000 per month, excuse me, \$1,000 total for each member of the family. Like a children or anything like that, that would cost them an extra 85¢ per month, or \$6.85 if they add the family to it. There is a second insurance policy a group insurance policy, available to the, which would give them \$20,000 worth of life insurance at \$12.00 a month. However, trooper Amos had, was not participating in either one of these programs and as far as the State is concerned, he is not getting any, his widow rather, is not getting any life insurance benefits from either one of the programs and consequently we have not been able to find out whether he had any private life insurance or not, but we do know for a fact that he is not getting anything in the way of life insurance benefits from the State. I would certainly whole heartedly support the bill. Thank-you.

SPEAKER: Is there any further comment on Senator Lewis's amendment? Senator Kelly.

SENATOR KELLY: Mr. President, members of the body, question of Senator Barnett. Senator Barnett, I would emotionally support this amendment and support this bill, but I'd like to know before I vote if there are precedence in this area of making special legislation in this area?

SENATOR SYAS: I, since I've been here longer than the rest, yes there is a precedence. We've done this before.

SENATOR SKARDA: Mr. President, if you'd a only talk about precedence, I think if this situation is properly taken care of
