SENATOR CARPENTER: I move the committee amendments be adopted.

PRESIDENT: All right. Question is, shall the committee amendments now to 111 as amended be adopted? All those in favor please say aye, those opposed say no. So ordered, the committee amendments are adopted. Apparently there are other amendments on the desk.

CLERK: Now Mr. President, we have some more amendments offered by Senator DeCamp. Okay, those amendments are withdrawn. That's all the amendments then, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Senator DeCamp is asking unanimous approval to withdraw his amendments. Are there objections? Hearing none, so ordered. They are withdrawn. All right, we're back now to the bill as amended by the committee amendments.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I move the bill be advanced to E & R for Initial.

PRESIDENT: Senator Fellman, did you want to speak on the bill as amended? Go ahead.

SENATOR FELLMAN: I have a question. Has Senator--I'm not sure that the amendments to section 8 have ever been voted on. Page 23, it's section 13 paragraph 8.

PRESIDENT: Those were your amendments?

SENATOR FELLMAN: Well, I talked about them and Senator Carpenter said he would accept it but I don't think we've done it.

CLERK: They were Senator Carpenter's amendments and I think they were adopted.

SENATOR FELLMAN: Oh, okay.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Now wait a second. We just adopted Senator Kelly's amendments which reinstated the stricken matter but it didn't give the option as you talked about.

SENATOR FELLMAN: Well, Senator Kelly's amendments reinstated matter on pages 21 and 22. Now we have to reinstate the stricken matter on page 23 and delete the additional matter all in paragraph 8 on page 23 and I don't think we've done that.

CLERK: We've done that. That was Senator Carpenter's amendment. Reads amendment. That was adopted.

PRESIDENT: All right, now. Senator Nore.

SENATOR NORE: Mr. President, I'd like to ask Senator Carpenter a question if he would yield.

PRESIDENT: Okay, he yields.

SENATOR NORE: I'd like to have a resume of the bill as it now stands with amendments. Just what is the main thrust of the bill and what does it do?

SENATOR CARPENTER: Well, I explained them all. I'd be glad to go through them again if you'd like.

SENATOR NORE: Yes, I'd like to have that done.

SENATOR CARPENTER: You, in page 9 for example the original amendments, increased the license fee on a class C license for a bottle club from \$250 to \$500. That has been changed so that the license fee for a bottle club now for a Class C license is \$250 like it is on every other. Now some members were concerned that the amendment was not made relative to the
