of the Governor's veto on LB 452 and it is a very interesting discussion here. All right, Senator Keyes.

SENATOR KEYES: Mr. President, I'd like to ask Senator Marvel just a couple of questions.

PRESIDENT: Senator Marvel will you yield to some questions?

SENATOR MARVEL: Yes sir.

SENATOR KEYES: Senator Marvel, I'm not building you up, but I have always had a great deal of respect for what you have said. I've never found too much wrong with it. Now Senator Marvel as DAS is now set up, and has been set up since the start, is it able to function and get the information and accumulate it and get it together?

SENATOR MARVEL: No sir, the compu, may I give you an example?

SENATOR KEYES: Yes, I'm interested.

SENATOR MARVEL: The computer operation which was reputed to be on of the top operations in the country, a few months ago, has been severely wounded by the fact that some of the top personnel are being forced to move all over the country in an effort somehow or other to carry out what they call bench marks, or testing of other equipment, this has been going on for months, at even, even with the top so that the efficiency of, of the computer operations is depreciated. All you have to do, to see this for instance, talk to Senator Warner, about how much information, how much trouble he has had trying to get information for 472. Talk to Senator Lewis, Frank Lewis, about the original run off on how many employees over, receiving over \$20,000 in this State. There were so many errors, that we finally had to type it up separately. So what I'm saying in regard to the computer operation is that it was running at about 50% capacity and I was told this by those who work in this area, and plus somebody misinterpret this. It wasn't strictly IBM officials that made this statement and there fore I think what we ought to do in that area, is get on with the business and get the States money or out of the that investment, that is the first point I'd make. Now there are other areas, but that is one. As far as accounting, as far as accounting is concerned which is another key area, even the State accountant himself in the reports agreed with the fact that the accounting system is far from being adequate at the moment. Those are two key area, that I stressed in my original remarks.

SENATOR KEYES: Senator Marvel, I am led to believe by your statement that this is not a failure of the Statutes or a failure of DAS but it is a failure of the manpower that is operating it. Is this --

SENATOR MARVEL: Well I think, I think the original thinking of those of us who sponsored the original legislation still is sound, but the system simply is not operating. That is true.

SENATOR KEYES: Well, Senator Marvel, thank-you. This just proves one thing to me, that we who approve of the appointment of Gus Liske, and Gus Liske runs DAS, appointed by the Governor approved by the legislature, and if we do not think he is doing his job, then certainly it isn't the responsibility of this legislature to do away with the system. You can find many people in this State that will disagree with the unicameral will disagree with the Governor, but we don't do away with our unicameral. We don't do away with the Governor of this State, we replaced him. Now if there is any thought in our minds that DAS is functioning wrong, because of the personnel, this legislature approves the personnel and let's do away with the personnel. But if it is not the system, but it is the people
