I've got a fertile mind and I only passed 259 as a result of the then coordination between the Exec..Chief Executive and myself and I would do the same thing over again because it was not a new idea. If you will go on my record, for whatever it is worth, you will find that almost every session I've attempted to pass a similar bill in order to attempt to have the Governors, to the extent that might be practical, have their way once to see if they are right or not. I realize to some extent we are shirking our responsibility. Now whether that is good or bad, that's up to the individual. For that reason, I move that we vote on this motion.
