PRESIDENT: Senator Nore--you--your light was on, went off, it's back on. Now, do you want to speak now? Just a minute. You're passing now--stand by. Senator Stull was next to speak.

SENATOR SYAS: Wait, I just ask something here.

PRESIDENT: Alright, go ahead.

SENATOR SYAS: Since some have said well we should give Senator Proud first shot at this on his motion. In all fairness and I'm still interested in mine, but in all fairness, I ask for unanimous consent to withdraw mine, vote on his and then we'll see how his comes out, then I'll make mine because I want to be fair, I don't want anybody saying that I'm not being fair to them. Let's vote on Proud's first.

PRESIDENT: Alright, Senator Syas is now, is asking unanimous consent to withdraw his motion. Now, Senator Stull, do you object to the withdrawal?

SENATOR STULL: No.

PRESIDENT: Thank you--

SENATOR STULL: I, I want to make one comment. The hearing set for, before the Judiciary Committee on Monday the 14th, so some of the members of the Judicar--Judiciary Committee will either have to be here or that hearing will have to be reset.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. Alright, are there any objections to withdrawal of Senator Syas' motion at this particular time? Hearing none, so ordered then we'll go back and we'll use Senator Proud's proposal and as now, I understand Senator Syas wants him to propose that as a motion so if that be the case then I'll, just stand by a minute. Senator Proud, we actually, as the Chair understands it, yours was a proposal of a plan but we don't really have a motion before the house. Senator Proud.

SENATOR PROUD: Oh, well, I'll just, for purposes of testing it, I'll make the motion.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. Alright, now next to speak was Senator Stull. He's off. Senator Nore and then Senator Mahoney. Okay, Senator Nore. We have now the--

SENATOR NORE: Fellow Members, I think we should set a precedent here. You don't have your bills in, in January, they have a pretty poor chance of, of making the deadline. We, we could keep that in mind. A lot of these bills here could have been in in December or the first part of January, the day, the first day we met and we'd have them out of the way, and probably we could introduce less bills too, would help.

PRESIDENT: Alright, Senator Mahoney.

SENATOR MAHONEY: Mr. President, I'd just like to mention that the June 7th date is going to leave a little late into the month and I, I want to mention this, that there's several meetings that the Senators are already committed to go to. There are on inter-governmental, they'll not be here, will not be present and it's a little late, Senator Proud, in your schedule. I think you're going too late into the month already. I think that after you have had a chance to vote on Senator Proud's motion here, that Senator Burbach does have the proper solution to it.
