SENATOR WALDRON: Mr. President and Members of the Legislature. I don't think it would be unfair if we would ask the staff to work on weekends and we give them a bonus for working at that time, if they're, if they're willing to do it, no reason why the Executive Board couldn't provide them with, with some sort of bonus for working on weekends and working on evenings rather than ask them just to work overtime.

The only reason I suggested a plan is that for you folks that want to plan your own personal affairs ahead, this way you have something to go by. If you don't, if you want to take it day by day, that's just fine with me. Either way is okay with me but I thought I must offer you some kind of a plan because some of you would expect that and, this, this plan here probably has a little fat in it in time of necessity because as I said, at any given time, we don't know how many bills will be on select file or E&R for Engrossment so I told Emory Burnett to allow himself enough time, but if you think you're going to get some bills through and, and you want to do that and it turns out that it's mechanically impossible to do it, then you're going to be sorry so I could care less which way you vote on this.
