Day then Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday and then Wednesday for June 6 for the veto override. However, if you'll look at the other one where we'll meet tomorrow, Monday and Tuesday and at this point I believe we get on buses at 2:00 or some such matter, if we were to meet at 3:00 that morning and go until 12:30 or 1:00 we could meet our schedule with the Omaha Chamber of Commerce and of course then this would be the 83rd day, it would be the last day for General File. If we proceed this way it would probably be advantageous for us not to read any bills on Final Reading tomorrow, Monday or Tuesday and let them accumulate for our legislative day on Wednesday or Thursday and then of course on Friday would be the last day for Select File. Then the following Monday and Tuesday would be recess and we would come back on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday, that would be the 89th day for Final Reading and then we'd have Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday would be our fifth day for the override. So that program or that schedule would let us adjourn sine die on the 90th day and give us an opportunity for the vetoes and we would be out of here on June 1. I do not ask for a vote at this time, I think if there are any questions I'll attempt to answer them, otherwise I think there's plenty of time to decide this tomorrow forenoon.

PRESIDENT: Senator Burbach, you plan to just put this out and you're going to decide the issue tomorrow?

SENATOR BURBACH: All the members have this without an initial on it, except Senator Syas, he does have an initial on his, but otherwise I'm asking that the membership look at the schedule and then make a determination tomorrow morning.

PRESIDENT: All right. We have some other business on the desk here.

CLERK: Reads announcements and reports.

PRESIDENT: Senator Warner. Go ahead.

SENATOR WARNER: Well, inasmuch as we never got to the bills that were scheduled for today, I would request that all four of them be rescheduled for tomorrow and I understand from visiting with Senator Proud that it was also ruled this morning that the other bills that are up there on General File that were set for a day certain but were not gotten to will be taken up immediately following that in their order and any other bills moved up would have to become behind those. It would seem to me that, but that is the polity, it will give us some idea of what is going to come up and each of us can be properly prepared for those few days that are left.

PRESIDENT: Let's see if the chair understands what you're doing here. You are proposing that those that were scheduled, bills on General File scheduled for today, May 10, be taken up tomorrow, May 11, first thing and that other bills which had been specifically assigned will follow after those bills. In other words, the first order of business will be those bills that were scheduled for debate today beginning with 472, 499, 577, 246, is that correct?

SENATOR WARNER: Yes.

PRESIDENT: And then what happens afterthat? You're proposing what?

SENATOR WARNER: Well, Mr. President, I understand Senator Proud indicated this morning that those other bills would be taken up in their order starting with 275 that they would be taken up like any other bill to be moved up would fall behind those which had previously been moved up if that makes sense.
