PRESIDENT: All right. Is there a need for further discussion of that motion? Question is, do you want to support that? All those in favor of that motion signify by saying aye, those opposed say no. So ordered then and that's the way that we'll determine it then. All right, now is there any further business to come before the body? All right, Senator Carpenter has something here.

CLERK: Okay, we have a motion from Senator Carpenter to add Legislative Bill 256, 505, 581, 582, 583, 579 and 327 be placed at the head of General File on May 16.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Now these are the bills that I discussed this morning which have to do with the capitalization of the budget committee and also the reopening of, if you so desire, a bill which has the same effect as 259 and this is to be effective on Wednesday at the head of General File. It seemed to me that these are bills of utmost importance and I would presume that this body would want to get themselves prepared to the point of knowing when they are coming up and studying the bills which are now in your book and make a determination whether you want to check them as they are, you want to amend them or what the position might be. I would presume because I have knowledge of a number of amendments that might take several days in order to work through these series of bills.

PRESIDENT: Is there any further discussion now of Senator Carpenter's proposal? Senator Waldron, did you wish to be heard on the issue?

SENATOR WALDRON: I was just going to mention that if we take the Burbach plan for adjournment, then they should come up on Tuesday rather than Wednesday, but if we decide that in the morning then the Clerk can have that understanding that they would come up on the last day for consideration of bills on General File.

PRESIDENT: Well, then does the chair understand you want to stand by with this motion until tomorrow? Senator Carpenter, to make a final determination on it? Why don't you hold it until tomorrow?

SENATOR CARPENTER: We haven't adopted any schedule yet and let it be pending on the Clerk's desk until we do.

PRESIDENT: Fine, all right. Any other business to come before the body?

CLERK: We have a motion to adjourn by Senator Syas.

PRESIDENT: Just a minute, Senator Barnett.

SENATOR BARNETT: I think I had a motion up there a long time ago, handed it to the Clerk. I would like to have 499 bracketed with 396 again because of the misunderstandings and the problems that are occurring. Therefore we can take it--it's over on General File. It was bracketed to be heard today on General File and I ask that now that it be bracketed with 396 I believe it is, Senator Whitney's bill. Unanimous consent on this.

PRESIDENT: Did you say 499?

SENATOR BARNETT: It's over on General File, you're looking the wrong way.

PRESIDENT: Sorry.

SENATOR BARNETT: The second one under 472.

PRESIDENT: You want it bracketed? All right, your motion is
