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we will have to try it if that is your desire to see if it will work.

SENATOR BARNETT: Well we can start here if this isn't the last day for General File and that is for sure.

PRESIDENT: Alright, Speaker Proud.

SPEAKER PROUD: Mr. President, Senator Carpenter did discuss this with me and it is alright as far as I am concerned. But I want to warn you about something here. You should look at this schedule that I prepared and the one that Senator Burbach had prepared. His schedule is actually the same as mine and that is fine, except that under his schedule as I read it we would not...we would not be taking off this coming Monday and we would meet Tuesday morning. Now other than that his schedule is exactly the same as mine. The result would be that we would adjourn sine die on June 1, instead of on June 6th. We would get out of here so to speak a little sooner, but any way that you slice it we are going to be down here exactly the same number of legislative days. His schedule provides for the full 90 days and so does mine. Mine was a little more leisurely that would give us a little more time but that is immaterial, absolutely immaterial to me personally. Now in regard to Senator Carpenter's suggestion we must keep this in mind. Under both Senator Burbach's schedule and mine there has to be a last day when you can move something off General File and assuming that Emery Burnett is correct under Senator Burbach's schedule the last day for general file would be this coming Tuesday, May 15. Now this is the kind of time that we are down to now. Here today is Friday and in a couple of days we are going to be down to the last day for considering General File. Well look up there at the board and see how many bills there are. It is my judgment that there is no possibility of getting through that list in a couple of days. Now under my proposed schedule the last day for general file would be Thursday, May 17th. In either event there is very little time left, so now what we are faced with is individuals Senators bills who want them heard and if you are interested in all of the bills that you have sponsored there is no way to do it in the time limitations. Anybody who doesn't believe this please get up and say so and tell me where I am wrong. So we have really got a problem as far as General File is concerned. Now with Senator Carpenter's suggestion if we start and go through just like they appear on your work sheet take all of the bracketed bill first and on down the line and any Senator who is not ready to take up his bill we put it at the bottom that has some problems. It may be a workable plan but it is certainly alright with me but this means that if you are out of the Chamber or if you have to be excused for some reason and they come to your bill it goes to the bottom of General File and if it does and it stays there in my judgment it will never be heard during this session. So I just open this up for some discussion because it is an extremely important matter and the more we hurry the process the less chance you are going to have having your bill heard. I realize that there are probably some of you and this is normal and natural that don't want your bills heard. Somebody got you to introduce it and maybe you are not worried about it but there are other bills that I am sure you are.

PRESIDENT: Senator Syas.

SENATOR SYAS: Well it seems to me that every morning we start off on something that we get our order of business mixed up. What was set for this morning was to find out whether we are going to have the left system or the right system on that chart.
